PRINCIPLE OF THE CURRICULUM

Classes I and II

At JSS, Jammu our aim is to draw upon the best elements of the curriculum combined with the depth and range of the subjects that are based on the age appropriate learning goals.

This primary curriculum builds curiosity and passion for learning in children as per appropriate age group.

The school believes in the system of learning by practising. It strengthens their understanding of a concept by giving them practical first hand experience of the concept through various activities.

Silent features of the curriculum:

The curriculum prescribed by the CBSE strives to

- Strong foundations for learning
- Learning with understanding
- Skills in applying knowledge
- Promote inclusive education by providing equal opportunities to all the students
- To develop skills in debating, discussing, questioning and problem solving.

NUMERACY AND LITERACY: In classes 1 and 2, the focus is on encouraging inquiry, exploration and on inculcating confidence in key learning skills – reading, writing, listening, speaking problem solving etc.

- Children are encouraged to speak and perform to gain confidence and to communicate to a wider audience through a team building ability.
- The student are observed on a regular basis for skill development and the evaluation is recorded on their listening, speaking, language, numeracy, gross motor, fine motor and socio economic skills.

The learning pedagogy is integrated with

- Role play, story narration and dramatisation.
- Problem solving activities
- Emphasis on vocabulary building and language skills

OBJECTIVES OF THE CURRICULUM : In grade 1 and 2 care is taken to ensure that learners acquire the right attitude that will prepare them for the future enabling them to acquire skills and knowledge in their journey ahead.

- We prepare them with a solid foundation in verbal and numerical skills.
- We emphasise on total communication i.e to communicate effectively active exercises in reading, writing speaking and listening.

ASSESSMENT : Scheme of examination for classes 1st and 2nd

- The academic session shall be divided in two terms; April – September and October –March
- Each term has one periodic test and one assessment.
- A progress report based on the unit term and assessment is issued after each term.
